Agenda Explanations



What are Personal Morning Devotions?

Each camper will be given a Camp Book at check-in. Personal Devotions are inside the Camp Book. During the Quiet Time each morning, campers are expected to complete their devotions.

What is the difference between Morning Chapel and Evening Chapel?

Morning Chapel will obviously be in the morning each day. The band will lead us all in worship by singing a few songs. Ergun Caner will speak briefly at each Morning Chapel. Morning Chapel has more of a Bible Study/Teaching atmosphere. Evening Chapel is after supper each evening. The band will be on stage longer and sing more songs. Ergun Caner will be bringing the sermon each evening.

What can I do during Free Time?

There will be PLENTY to do during Free Time. Some campers like to use this time for recreation and games while others like to sit around and get to know other campers.

What is Group Rec?

Group Recreation takes place on Monday and Wednesday after Lunch. During this time, there will be organized games. These games range from sports to cup-stacking to card games and the list goes on. There will be something for everyone. Campers will need to sign up for their Group Recreation by the end of Evening Free Time on Sunday.

What is Color Wars?

Campers will be given a colored wristband at check-in. That wrist-band must remain on the camper at all times. The color of that wrist-band will determine the team the camper will be on during Color Wars. Color Wars will be an unforgettable time of FUN! Lots of team events (not sport related) will take place during that time.

Camp Rules



1. Everyone is expected to strive to imitate the character of Jesus Christ throughout each moment of our time together.
2. If anyone has medication of any kind, **it must be turned in to the camp nurse upon check-in.**
3. In order to avoid distraction and enhance Biblical focus, BRBC Youth Camp has the following cell phone regulations:
 - a. **Cell phone use WILL BE LIMITED.**
 - b. **If you choose to bring a cell phone, BRBC Church Camp is not liable for the phone.**
4. No PDA (Public Display of Affection)--This will not be tolerated. Yes, we know this is a teen camp. However, our desire is for young people to grow closer to the Lord during their time at camp. "Bible Space" will be explained during our camp meeting on the first day.
5. Male campers are not allowed in the Girls' Cabins. Female campers are not allowed in Boys' Cabins.
6. Modest clothing required (this goes for boys and girls). If you have questions about whether or not a piece of clothing would be acceptable at camp--ask your Great Grandma or give your youth leader a call and ask them.
7. Campers should not have any type of weapon, including pocket knives.
8. Absolutely no tobacco, alcohol, or vaping products. No use of illicit drugs. Zero Tolerance!!! We Can Search Bags!
9. Campers must stay within the boundaries outlined by the directors.
10. **All campers and staff** are to attend all scheduled events unless excused by the camp nurse or directors.
11. No sexual misconduct (defined as exposure, touching, or inappropriate reference to body areas normally covered by undergarments).
12. No use of profane language.
13. Name calling, fighting, bullying, arguing, profanity or any other aggressive behaviors are strictly prohibited at camp. Play safely and use good sportsmanship.
14. You are expected to abide by all camp rules. If you do not conduct yourself in a proper Christian manner, the directors have the right to send you home. If you have any items with you that are inconsistent with the rules, they should be turned in to the directors.

What To Bring



- A good attitude!
- Clothing
 - *Bring extra pairs of clothes!*
 - *Don't forget socks and underwear! Bring extras!*
 - *Include some gym clothes or old clothing for recreation.*
 - *Shorts need to be an acceptable length. Tank tops with wide straps are accepted. No open-sided shirts, bare mid-riffs, or see through tops. No clothing with offensive messages. Think MODEST—this is CHURCH CAMP.*
- Tennis Shoes (this is a MUST)
- Flip-flops/shower shoes
- Twin Sheets and blanket or sleeping bag, pillow
- Towels & wash cloth (or shower poof—whatever you use)
- Water Bottle
- Trash bag for dirty/wet items
- Medications (*Prescriptions*)
- Toiletries (*soap, shampoo, comb/brush, toothpaste, toothbrush, etc.*)
- **DEODORANT!!**
- Sunscreen
- Bible, highlighter, pencil, journal
- ***Optional Items***
 - \$ for Snacks and Souvenirs
 - Small fan and cord
 - Insect repellant
 - Sunglasses
 - Flashlight
 - Swim Clothes (There may be an opportunity to go swimming. Swim clothes need to cover up your body! T-shirts will be worn by both boys and girls. As mentioned in the rules, if you're questioning modesty—give your Great Grandma a call or talk to your youth leaders.)

DO NOT BRING

- A bad attitude.
- Super expensive stuff that's going to get lost, broken, or stolen
- Weapons of any kind.
- Clothing that shows your undergarments while you're wearing it.
- Clothing that shows anything your undergarments were invented to cover.
- Headphones or earbuds. This is a group event. You can jam out to your own tunes at home.

BRBC Youth Camp Waiver and Release of Liability Form

I understand that the BRBC Youth Camp may exclude my child from camp in the event that I or my child fail to abide by the BRBC Youth Camp's rules and safety protocols, disrupt, impede or interfere with the operations of the Camp, or threaten the health, safety or welfare of other participants or Camp staff, and that no refund will be made in such circumstances.

Medical Consent: I understand that the BRBC Youth Camp will make every effort to contact me in the case of an emergency. I give my permission for the BRBC Youth Camp nurse to administer any medications needed and to provide and arrange for and consent to any necessary medical treatment for my child while at the Camp according to the medical form, including onsite and offsite emergency care.
